Right results for "Bin it right"

Residents across County Durham are getting it right when it comes to recycling their rubbish. Durham County Council launched the "Bin it right" campaign in April to get people to put the right items in the right bin to stop recyclable material being contaminated and made unusable.

Recycling assistants have knocked on nearly 30,000 doors and given advice to thousands of people and early indications show the message is getting across with fewer items such as nappies, pet waste, plastic children's toys, polystyrene, clothes and food, going in with the recycling.

Cllr Brian Stephens, Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local partnerships, said, "Residents are responsible for their own waste and we would like to thank people for recycling items in the correct way.

"Recycling assistants are working with crews to

help residents understand what items go in which bin. If non-recyclable items are spotted before being tipped into the wagon it saves the whole load from being rejected. "Contaminated waste not only reduces recycling rates but also costs the authority about £100 a tonne in alternative disposal."

Alan Patrickson, head of projects and business services, Durham County Council, said, "The amount collected for recycling has increased by more than 30 per cent since the introduction of the blue lidded recycling bins in 2012 and this latest campaign is helping residents to keep putting the right items in the right bin.

"On the whole, County Durham residents are good recyclers and with this campaign we have been looking to reduce the 10 per cent of waste that ends up contaminated and no good for

recycling."

Contaminated bins will not be emptied and in the case of repeated contamination, residents will be notified directly by letter and asked to remove the contaminated items before putting the bin out for collection.

Recyclable items should be washed and squashed where possible and placed loose in the recycling bin without being bagged. Further information on what items go where is available at www.durham.gov.uk/whatgoeswhere or call 03000 26 1000.

Neurolinguistic Programming (NLP) is a treatment

The sessions can be for as long as the individual wants. For some it works straight away, while for others it takes more sessions.

The clients' family is welcome also, to gain an understanding of what their loved one is going through.

"These treatments are free to service and ex-service personnel and their families, so with no cost everyone can relax and work together to make

them feel better within themselves," said a spokesperson.

The event takes place on Saturday 15th November. Doors open at 7pm before the evening's entertainment kicks off at 7.30pm.

The main act on the night is rock band 'Dirty Love' who will perform great live music with songs from the likes of Bon Jovi, AC/DC and Bryan Adams, as well as more up-to-date music from Stereophonics, Kings Of Leon and the Kaiser Chiefs mixed in with some classic rock and roll.

Have your say...

Dear Editor,

A Parish Poll took place on Monday 13th October, asking residents of Ferryhill 'Do you agree that development and regeneration in Ferryhill should be on brownfield and existing sites before building on countryside and green spaces?'

A landslide 85% of the voters agreed with the question posed. The poll was called by members of the community via the Dean Road and Dean Park Residents' Association, following a consultation held by Story Homes on the prospect of building 200 houses and a minimarket on green open space south of Dean Road.

This suggested development would have numerous negative impacts on the community of Ferryhill were it to be given the go ahead; not only would it needlessly turn the countryside into concrete and houses and further increase the risk of accidents by bringing even more traffic into the town, it would also jeopardise future developments on brownfield areas and any investment in regenerating the core of the town.

Before any suggestion of building on green open spaces can reasonably be made, the derelict ex-industrial land in Ferryhill must be regenerated and developed, as must the many boarded-up, run-down and empty properties. There is plenty of land and affordable housing stock available in the town at present to satisfy projected housing requirements.

Through the outcome of this poll, we hope to send a clear message to Ferryhill Town Council, Durham County Council and Story Homes that the people of Ferryhill do not want our countryside to be built on and would much prefer to see regeneration and development of existing and brownfield sites.

On Monday 13th October 2014 a Parish Poll was held in Ferryhill and the following question was put to the electors:

"Do you agree that development and regeneration in Ferryhill should be on brownfield and existing sites before building on countryside and greenfield spaces"?

Officers, supported by Labour Councillors, communicated with the residents and tried to explain the situation and save the approximate costs to the taxpayers of Ferryhill of: £4,700.

While Ferryhill Town Council appreciates the views of the electorate of the parish, the outcome of a parish poll is no more and no less than an expression of the views of the electorate of the parish who have voted in the poll. It is not binding and Town Councils are not required to accept the outcome.

Sections 9 and 13 and Schedule 12 (Part III) Local Government Act 1972 and The Parish and Community Meetings (Polls) Rules 1987 (SI 1987/1) Representation of the People (England and Wales) Regulations 2001 (SI 2001/341) refer.

The outcome of the poll was:

Ballot papers issued	207
Approximate total cost	£4,500
Cost per vote	£22.70

The Mayor of Ferryhill and Chair of the Town Council, Councillor Pauline Crathorne, said "each and every planning application should be assessed on its own individual merit and commented on. Labour Members have not made any comment on the proposed plans for the Dean Road area as the application has not been submitted to the planning authority 'Durham County Council' as far as I am aware at this moment in time. When and if an application is submitted, that is the time that the application will be considered."

Police pursuit ends successfully

A man has been arrested after a car he was driving lost control on the outskirts of Bishop Middleham on Tuesday 14th October, following a short pursuit by police.

Durham Police were alerted to an incident at the filling station in Thinford during the early hours of 14th October, where a vehicle made a sharp exit without paying for fuel.

The Black VW Polo had been stolen earlier from a property in Spennymoor. The vehicle's details were circulated and a short time later it was spotted by an unmarked police car. The police vehicle followed the offending car and co-ordinated other resources as to the location and direction of travel.

After a short police pursuit the vehicle was abandoned and a pursuit took place on foot.

Inspector Ed Turner from the Cleveland and Durham Special Operations Unit said, "Following a short pursuit, a 21 year-old man from the Shildon area was detained and arrested for offences including a dwelling burglary, aggravated vehicle taking, dangerous driving, failure to stop, having no insurance and no licence. This man was remanded in custody."

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The Celtic blow Durham away

Ferryhill Celtic played Durham Seniors in the JD Gaurds Cup at the weekend, and in difficult blustery conditions the Celtic were in scintillating form, in front of large home support. The Celtic were sharp out of the traps and within 5 minutes of the kick-off the Celtic were in front, when an on form Luke Thompson latched onto an inch perfect through-ball by Liam Pierson, who hit a sweet shot from just inside the box which flew into the bottom corner.

After 15 minutes it was 2 when the sublime Jason White drove into the box, only for the defender to bring him down and Celtic legend Jonny Agar made no mistake from the spot. It was now one way traffic and the Celtic swept forward again and a four man move resulted in Luke Thompson smashing a half volley into

the roof of the Durham net. But to Durham's credit, they did not let their heads go down and a shot from the edge of the box made the score 3-1. The Celtic hit straight back when the hard working Marco Linhart latched onto a ball in the box and finished in style, driving the ball into the roof of the net. Just before half time a cheeky Liam Pierson back-heal found Jonny Agar in the box and he coolly put the ball into the top corner of goal to make the score 5-1 at half time.

The second half was much the same story as the first with the Celtic keeping the ball on the ground, and on 55 minutes the Celtic got their 6 when the classy Dan Mitton combined with Ben Clarey to find that man again Jonny Agar, who again found the net to complete an impressive hatrick. The Celtic
