



Ferryhill Town Council awarded £75,000 for new Sports Pavilion

Remembrance Day Celebrations

Ferryhill Town Council is celebrating after receiving £75,000 National Lottery funding from Sport England's Inspired Facilities fund, to enable a new Sports Pavilion to be built at Mainsforth Sports Complex.

Since 2011, Inspired Facilities has been helping breathe

new life into tired community sports facilities and converting existing buildings into venues suitable for grassroots sport. The new Sports Pavilion will replace the existing Cricket Pavilion at Mainsforth Sports Complex which is old and tired and, having deter-

riorated rapidly in recent years, would not have lasted another season without having to be condemned on health and safety grounds. The new facility will be home to Mainsforth Cricket Club and will provide a base for the Ferryhill Wheelers Cycling Club and potentially other sports in the area, as well as offering facilities to local schools. The total cost of the project is expected to be in the region of £330,000. Ferryhill Town Council will be contributing £50,000 towards the project and has already secured £100,000 from the Lafarge Tarmac Landfill Communities Fund, £55,000 from local Councillors Brian Avery, Pauline Crathorne and Pat McCourt's Neighbourhood Budgets via the 4Together Partnership, with the remaining £50,000 required for the project having been applied for from the England Cricket Board (ECB). Planning Permission has already been secured for the project, a Project Manager, Sports Clubhouses have been appointed to oversee the project delivery and capital work is expected to commence onsite in January 2015.

In particular, Investing in Children works to ensure that children and young people have a voice, and are able to influence the services they use. The award recognises schools where students are welcomed to participate in all aspects of decision making processes in order to make it a better place. Since 2009, Ferryhill Business & Enterprise College have demonstrated, to the satisfaction of the young people who use the service that: 'They have been involved in dialogue' and 'Change has come about as a result'. The College encourages the involvement of student participation through a variety of different aspects

of decision making within the school. The student council is one example of this type of group. This helps to create new initiatives and projects through the positive relationship that exists between many students and staff and this brings about changes at the school. The school encourages young people to engage with teachers & senior management on a variety of decision making processes on issues that are important to both staff and students. A special mention was also given to the anti-bullying ambassadors who have completed work that has really impressed the assessors. The Anti-Bullying Ambassadors Programme is a recent peer led initiative in school which came about as a result of four Peer Mentors being invited to attend a Diana Award Training Day. The school initially invited Peer Mentors to set up the programme as they had already received training in active listening and mentoring. The Ambassadors were invited to sit on this year's

Peer Mentor interview panel where they helped to select the current Year 8 Peer Mentors at FBEC. This has given them the confidence to look at organizing their own recruitment campaign in school to recruit more Anti-Bullying Ambassadors. Recently they have secured £250 from Keyfund which they have used to acquire badges and Polo Shirts so that students can identify them in school. They will shortly be applying for the second level which is £500 which they hope to use to set up a school Anti-Bullying Website. Jan Spencer, Anti-Bullying Ambassador at FBEC said, "I am very proud of the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors who continue to lead a peer led anti-bullying programme in school. They are seen as positive role models and they are supporting younger students and encouraging their peers to get involved with various initiatives in school to promote friendship and caring for each other. They are acquiring skills and confidence which they themselves can use in their own learning."

Dear Editor,

I would like to reassure the people of Ferryhill, and especially those in Ferryhill Station, that there is NO foundation to the view, as suggested in a local leaflet, that Ferryhill Station Primary School is at risk of closure. The school is a Primary and Early Years School (children from 3yrs – 11yrs), not an infant school as stated on the leaflet. The school is thriving with 82 pupils and now also has 13 nursery children.

The education department at County Hall thinks highly of the school, as Caroline O'Neill (Head of Education) says in her recent letter after the school's highly successful Ofsted inspection. She writes that the judgement is a very clear endorsement of the success of the school and a judgement that we should feel very proud of. Ofsted was particularly impressed that "leaders and governors are ambitious and dedicated; they put pupils at the heart of everything they do".

In the twenty-eight years I have been at Ferryhill Station Primary School, I have NEVER been informed, or heard rumours, about the possibility of the school being at threat of closure. The school, I'm sure, will remain open and continue to be a successful school for many years to come.

Garden waste

Residents in Ferryhill and Chilton are reminded that the final garden waste collections for this year take place between 28th October and 7th November.

Exact collection days can be checked by putting your postcode into "My Durham" on Durham County Council's website www.durham.gov.uk.

So far this year, almost 20,000 tonnes of garden waste has been collected from properties in the Chester-le-Street, Derwentside, Easington, Durham, Sedgfield and Wear Valley areas. This has all been turned into compost for use on local farms.

During the winter, garden waste can continue to be recycled by composting at home or taken to any of the household waste recycling centres across the county.

Details of your nearest recycling centre and opening times can be found at www.durham.gov.uk/HWRC.

From next spring there will be an annual fee of £20 for garden waste collections from the kerbside and residents will need to sign up to receive the service. Almost 10,000 households have already signed up.

An additional 35,000 properties which have not previously been covered by the scheme will also be able to subscribe for garden waste collections.

By signing up, residents receive 16 fortnightly collections between spring and autumn. Anyone opting to take up a three year subscription will get a discounted rate of £50.

Residents are asked to subscribe before 1st February to ensure they receive all collections in 2015.

Durham County Council has picked up a national award for a scheme which has seen more than 2,200 tonnes of furniture and household items saved from disposal and provided for families on low income. The County Durham Reuse forum received the prestigious Best Partnership Award from the LARAC (Local Authority Recycling Advisory Committee), the national local authority watchdog on recycling standards. The forum, a partnership with the county council, has six reuse schemes across the county and in 2012/13 some 24,000 households received a wide variety of items ranging from sofas and beds to tables and chairs. They also provided 189 full

or part-time jobs with help from 210 volunteers and 84 work training placements. Terry Collins, corporate director, neighbourhood services, Durham County Council, said: "This award is testament to the hard work and dedication of everyone involved and recognises the very positive feedback we have received from the public and the fact we have been able to help so many people." The forum was highlighted as working successfully with partners in providing help and support in the county's most deprived communities. Steve Mitton, of the County Durham Furniture Help Scheme in Chilton, said, "This award demonstrates the value of the County

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Tackling the supply of illegal tobacco

More than 11,000 cigarettes and nearly 9kg of rolling tobacco have been seized as part of a crack-down on the supply of illegal tobacco in County Durham.

Trading Standards officers from Durham County Council and Durham Constabulary police officers searched two premises in Chilton and Newton Aycliffe on Friday 24th October.

Both raids netted a total of 11,140 cigarettes and nearly 9kg of rolling tobacco - all of which was believed to be counterfeit, smuggled or made specifically for the illegal market.

The seizure was the latest in a series of operations carried out by Trading Standards officers and police in a bid to cut the supply of illicit tobacco in the county.

Owen Cleugh, Durham County Council's consumer protection manager, said: "This is one of our most significant hauls to date and steps up the pressure on those supplying tobacco illegally.

"The regularity with which we are carrying out these operations in County Durham sends a clear warning to those who flout the law.

"We would like to thank the public for providing us with a wealth of intelligence concerning the supply of illegal tobacco. This kind of activity undermines the work of the stop smoking services and could encourage young people to pick up the habit."

Cllr Brian Stephens, Cabinet member for neighbourhoods and local part-

nerships, said: "We are determined to cut off the supply of illicit tobacco in County Durham and this operation was part of our efforts. We will continue to work with the police to keep the pressure on those involved in this harmful trade."

Temporary Inspector Dave Barker, of Durham Constabulary, said: "This operation was planned on the back of information from the community and involved a number of different police teams including our Alcohol Harm Reduction Unit.

"We will continue to respond to any new information which comes in,

and even if people do not see instant results they can be assured further actions will be planned."

Anyone found guilty of supplying counterfeit tobacco can face up to 10 years in jail, unlimited fines and their assets may be seized.

As a result of Friday's operations a man and two women were arrested before being released on bail pending further enquiries.
